

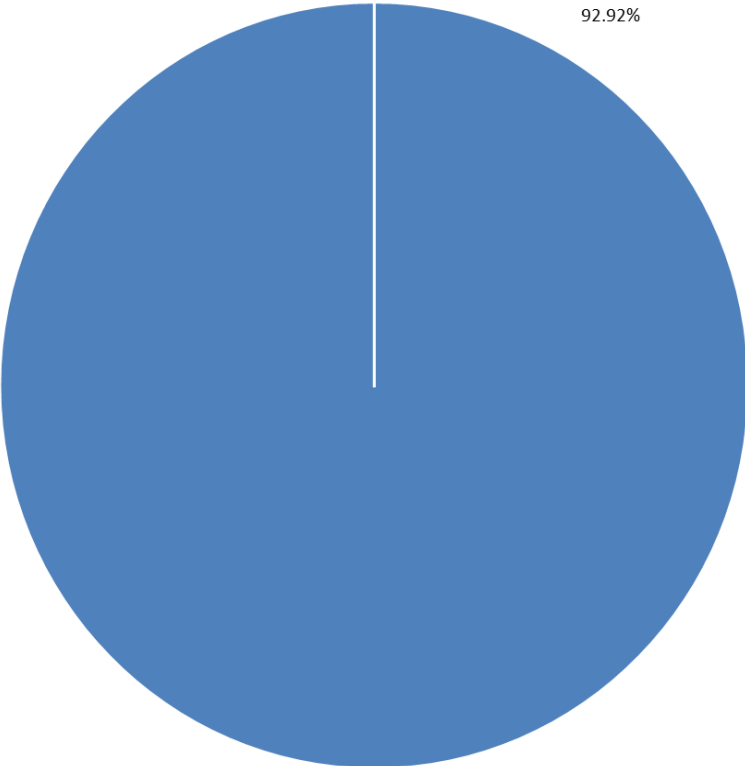
# Patient Outcomes, 2025

## Cindy and Tod Johnson Center for Pediatric Feeding Disorders



In 2025, the Feeding Programs treated 79 day patients. The average admission was approximately 31 days (range: 7-40). On average, our patients achieved 93% of their admissions goals of care.

Percentage Admission Goals Achieved, 2025 (n=79)

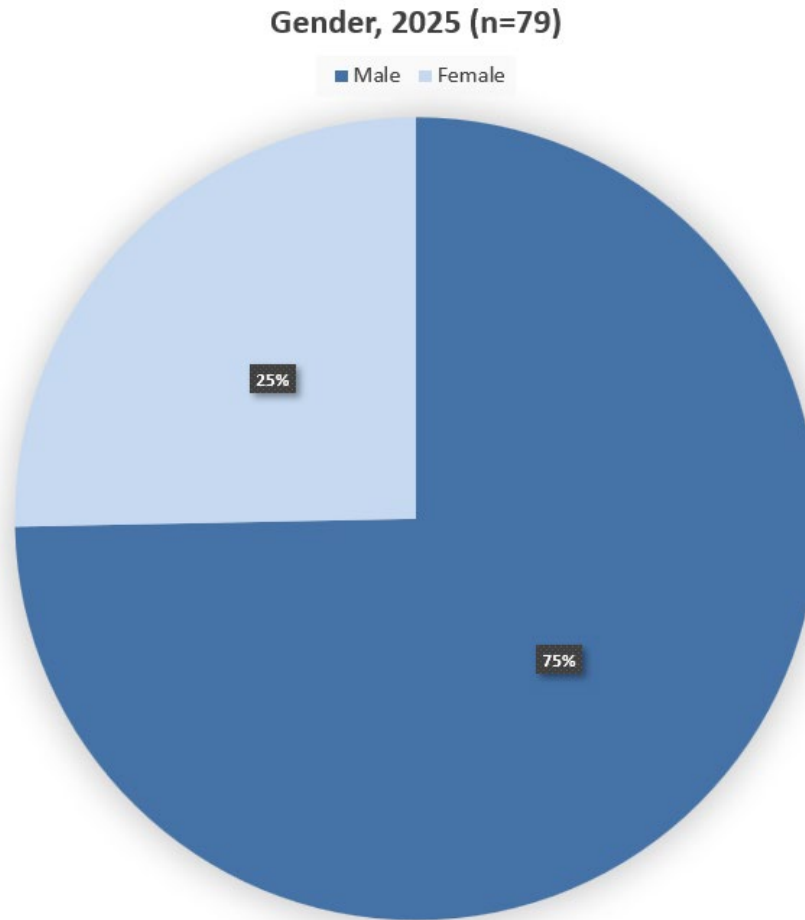


# Failure to Thrive

- 19 patients (25%) had a diagnosis of Failure to Thrive (FTT)
- For those patients, the average weight gain was 0.958kg (approximately 2.1lbs)
- The average FTT patient had a 5.6% weight gain by time of discharge.

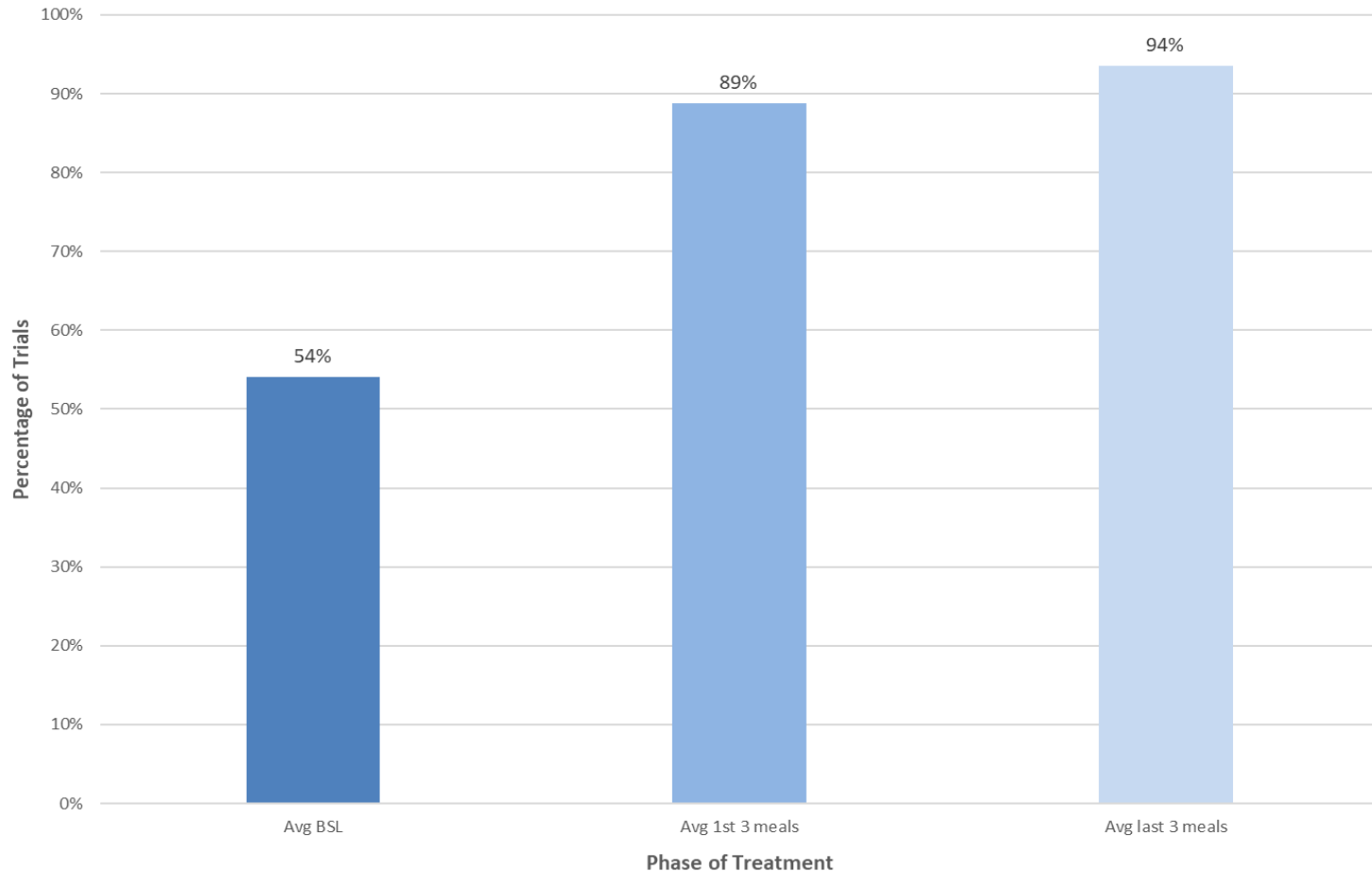


The majority of patients were male, which has been the prevailing pattern.



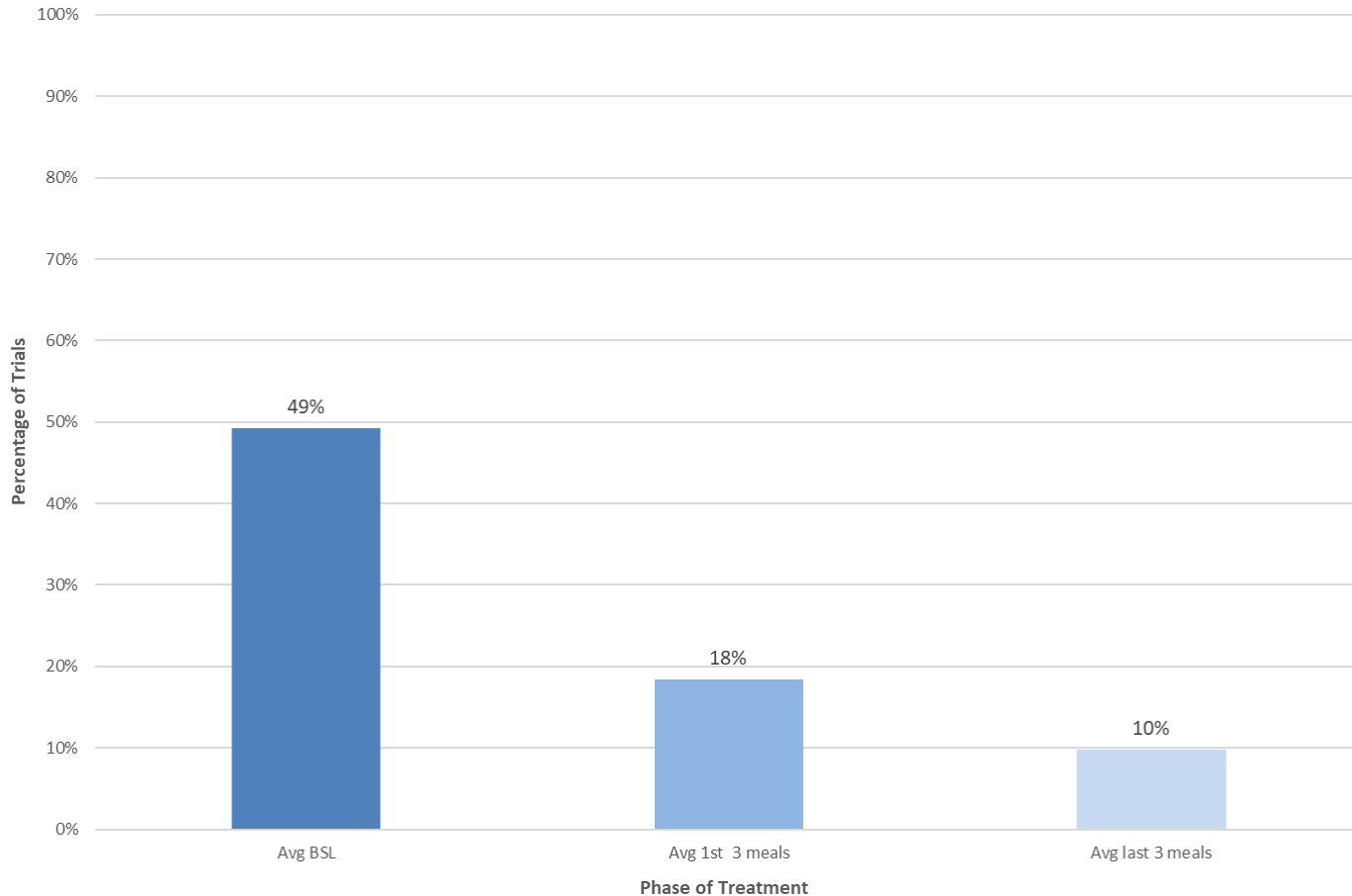
The average patient accepted food/drink during 54% of trials at baseline and 94% of trials at discharge, a 40% increase in acceptance behaviors.

Acceptance Behaviors, percentage of trials, 2025 (n=79)

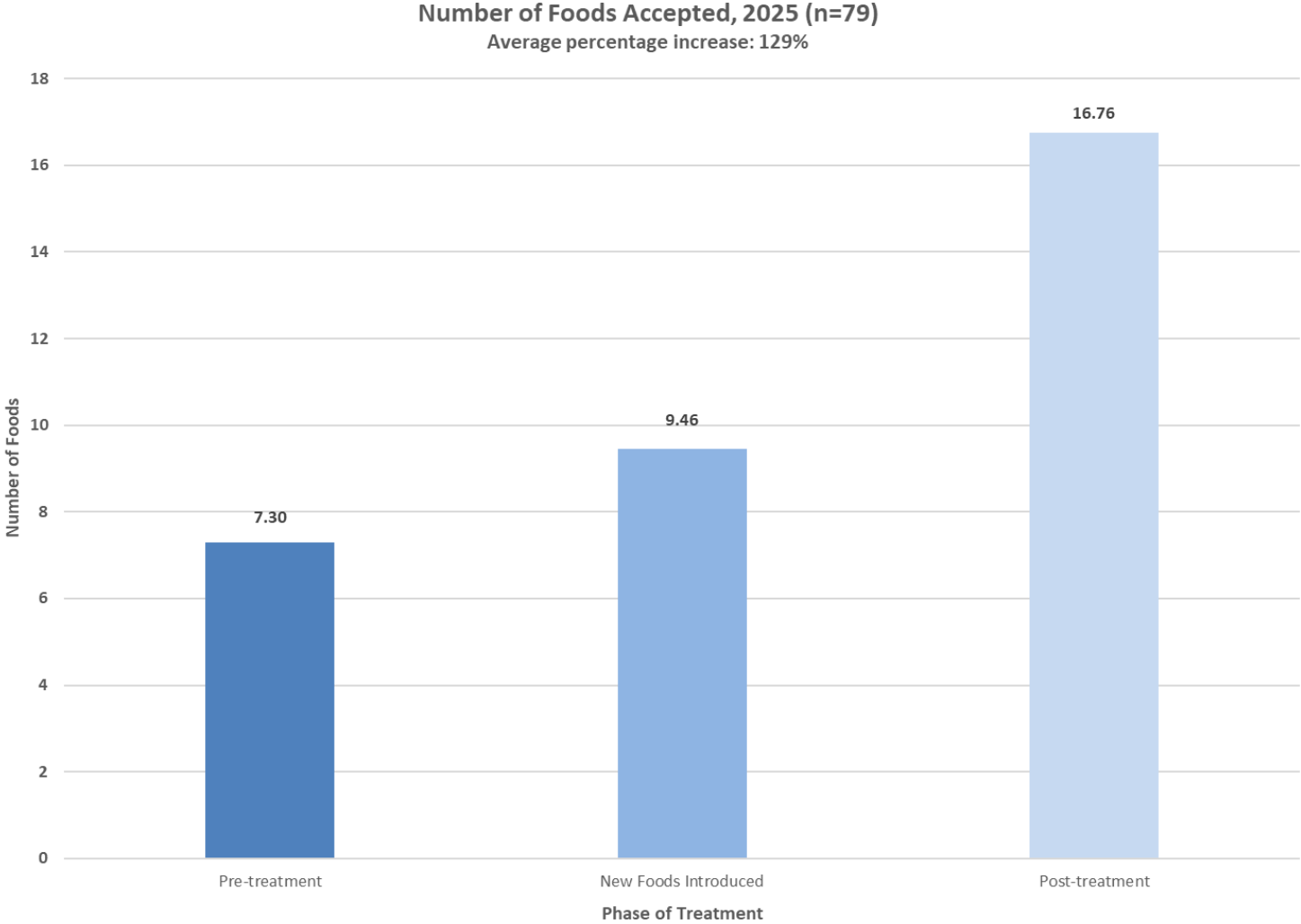


On average, patients decreased interruption behaviors by 39% from baseline to last 3 sessions.

Interruption Behaviors, percentage of trials, 2025 (n=79)

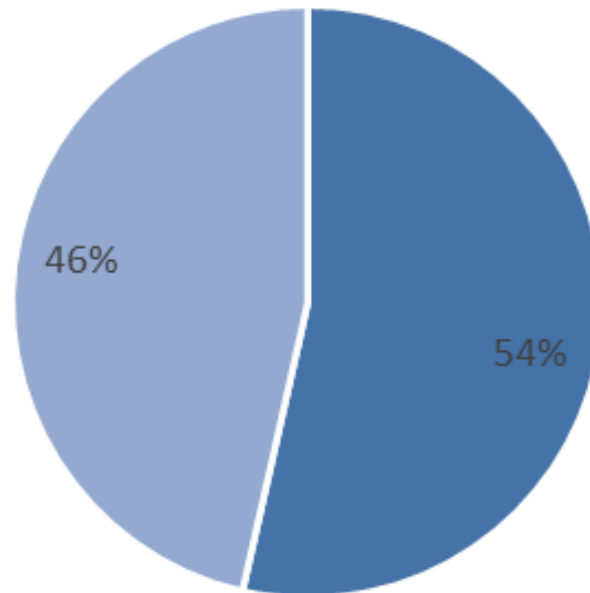


On average, patients added approximately 10 new foods, an increase of 129%, to their diets.

Breakdown of Therapist and Caregiver Training Meals, 2025 (n=79)

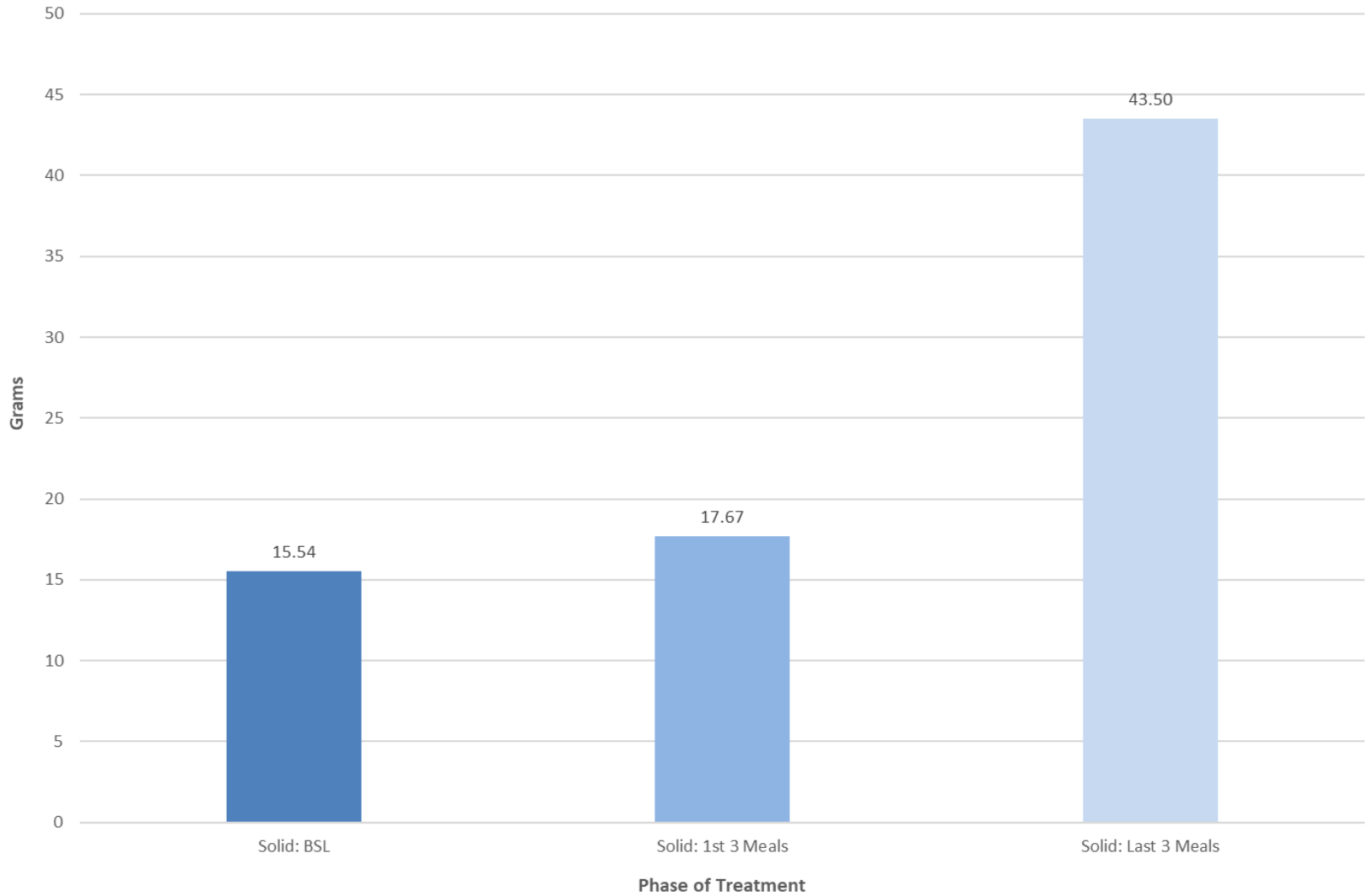


■ CGT ■ Therapist



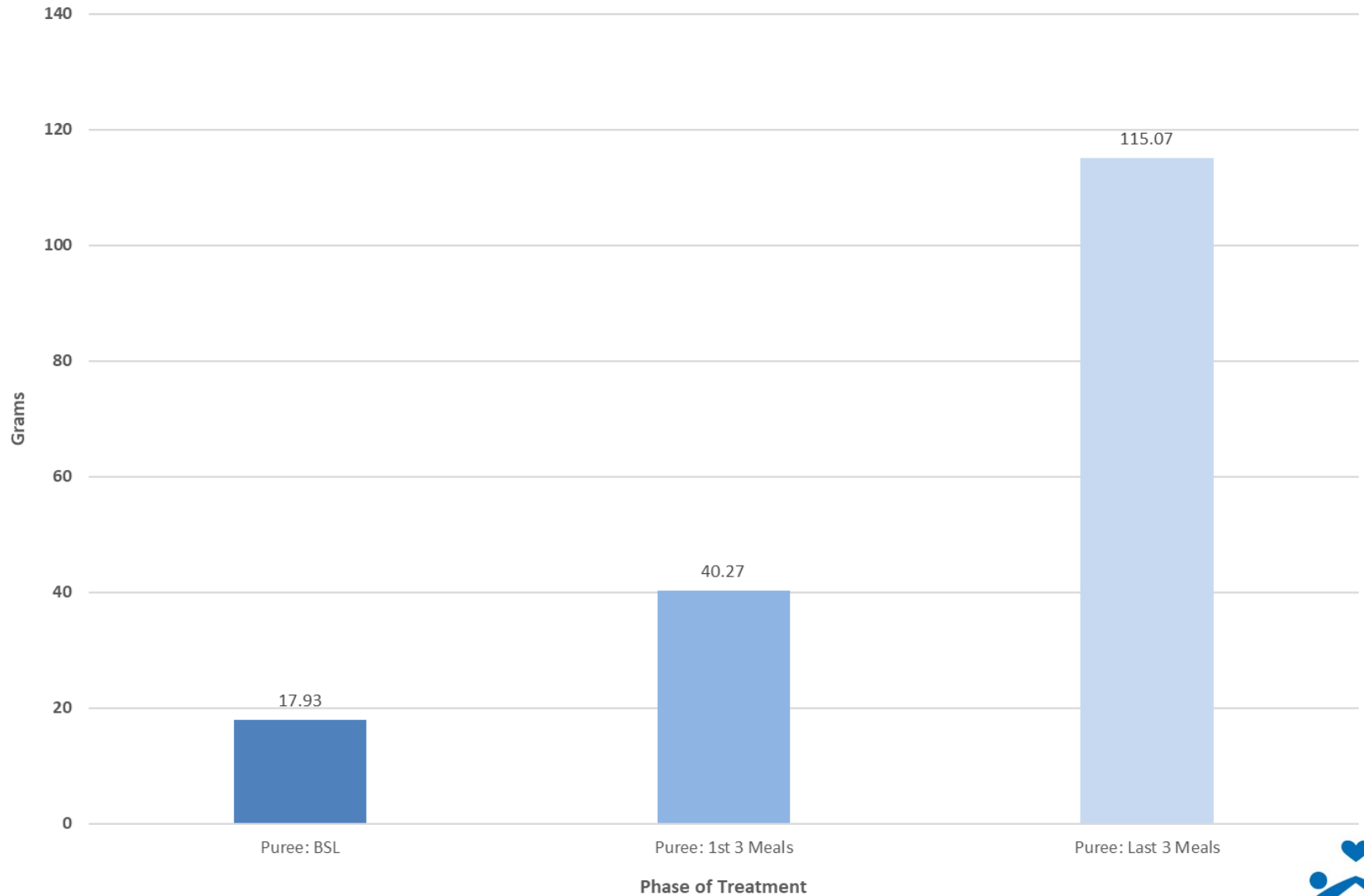
### Grams per Meal: Solids Only, 2025 (n=29)

Average percentage increase: 180%



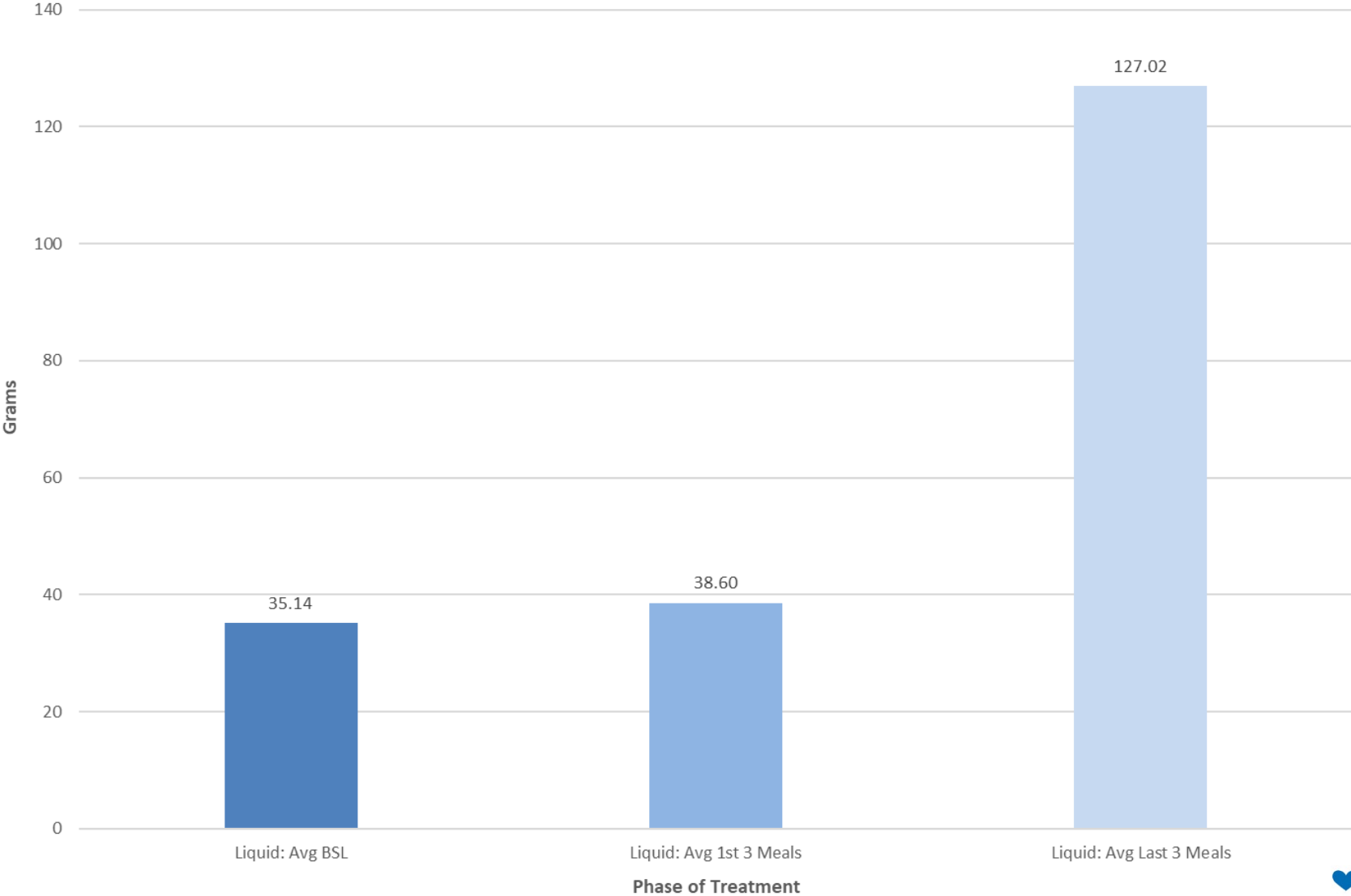
## Grams per Meal: Puree Only, 2025 (n=56)
