
Faces you see at St. Mary's....

Project TALK

Have you seen any of these pictures placed in and around your child's unit? They are an important part of a new program at St.

Mary's called Project TALK. TALK stands for "Technology Assisted Language for Kids". A large part of Project TALK is using Augmentative Alternative Communication (ACC). AAC is any form of non-verbal communication that a child uses to interact. It



may be unaided (simple signs, gestures, facial expressions) or aided (communication boards, voice output switches, or high tech AAC devices). St. Mary's Speech Therapy staff is starting Project TALK on our Nursery Unit and will be creating an individualized communication plan for many of our children. You will also see many staff wearing "badge reels" like the one shown below or may see a communication binder in your child's room. Staff from many departments will be using these items while working with your children to learn this method of communication. Project TALK aims to help our kids reach their maximum potential and improve their interactions



with parents, families and caregivers. Please speak with one of our Speech Therapists for more information.


Family Advisory Council

A New Testing Option

St. Mary's is implementing a new option for COVID 19 testing. Using a rapid test, you can now test at home.
